Through a neurodevelopmental and trauma informed approach the Integrated Practice Clinician engages the community care teams of children, youth and families in a collaborative treatment effort to help mitigate the impact of abuse, trauma, neglect, violence and other adverse childhood experiences on their well-being and help increase their care environment and relationship and relational stability.
