Provide on-site childcare, starting September 1, 2026, to children attending the Irene Kelleher Toti:Itawtxw Elementary School during regular school days, offering both before-school and after-school supervision. This role also includes delivering full-day care during school breaks, ProD days, and early-dismissal days.

Your Role:

Archway's Out of School Care Worker with the Eagle's Nest Early Learning Centre contributes by:

- Working with the children, family, staff, and supervisor to provide an engaging early childhood experience for school age children.
- Carrying out developmentally appropriate activities and experiences for the children, which include indoor/outdoor, and active/quiet activities.
- Attending to the children's physical needs.
- Attending to the children's psychological and emotional needs.
- Providing a healthy, safe, caring, and nurturing environment. Administering First Aid when necessary. Observing and removing potential hazards.
- Building and maintaining relationships with the parents/caregivers.
- Using the Early Learning Framework and emergent curriculum to provide an environment that reflects the interests of the child.
