Working flexibly across homes, schools, communities, and offices, you'll collaborate with professionals including educators, healthcare providers, Indigenous service organizations, and community agencies to deliver holistic care. Qualifications for this role include:

- Master's degree in counselling, social work, educational counselling, clinical counselling, clinical psychology or child and youth care or comparable graduate degree at the master's level in a similar subject may be considered.
 - Applicants near completion of their master's degree may be considered at a lower classification
- Minimum of 1 year full-time equivalent experience working with children and youth and their families, with responsibility for providing a wide range of community based mental health services.

Preference may be given to applicants with the following:

- Preference may be given to applicants with 2+ years of experience working with children and youth and their families, with responsibility for providing a wide range of community based mental health services.
- Preference may be given to applicants with experience in early childhood education.
- Preference may be given to applicants who self-identify as having an Indigenous heritage (First Nations, Métis, or Inuit) with the required combination of education and experience.
