Pilot Project Outreach & Supporting Partnerships

The Community Social Services (CSS) WorkSafeBC Pilot provided updates to the BC CEO Network, the Federation of Community Social Services of BC General Meeting, and was actively involved at the CSSEA 2016 Conference in October.

The Project continues to work with the 13 pilot employers on the Disability Management & Stay At Work/Return To Work process at the agency level concerning worker injuries and claims. The Pilot is also working closely with pilot employers' 3rd Party Benefit Administrators to ensure case management and Return To Work / Stay At Work / Recovery At Work plans for injured workers.

Migration of Classification Units (CU) & CSS Sector CU Rate Making/Forming

The Pilot is a cost neutral and/or cost reduction initiative, and many employers participating in the migration would have been facing increases. The migration process was put on hold due to similar 2016 Rates in Long Term Care (CU#766007) & RSSF (CU#766007).

WorkSafeBC proposed preliminary 2017 Classification Unit Rates for the Community Social Service sector indicate overall decreases. This is very good news for the sector and the Pilot will be working diligently to support employers to start a trend downward in Rates.

Discussions also continue around the Community Social Services (CSS) Sector CU Rate(s) to ensure they are classified in the correct classification unit(s). It is important for community social service employers to examine if they are in the correct Classification Unit, if there are any questions please Contact Pilot for more information.

CSS Sector Injury Prevention and Resource Information Development

The Project continues to work with WorkSafeBC and Pilot employers in developing community social service sector specific resources/materials on injury prevention, disability management and return to work. Currently, there are two documents that are being developed: the "Employer's Community Social Services Health & Safety Handbook", and the "Community Social Services Injury Management (Recovery At Work) Road Map". These resources are nearing completion, and are in the process of undergoing review they are expected to be released in March/April 2017.

Upcoming Pilot Activities

In November the Pilot and WorkSafeBC plans on presenting to the Human Resources Vancouver Island Group. The Pilot will also be meeting with Federation of Community Social Services of BC staff and hopes to meet with community social service employers while in Victoria.

The Pilot will also continue to work with WorkSafeBC to build on further Best Practices sessions/workshops for the CSS sector and will follow-up with the 26 pilot employers.

Accreditation & WorkSafeBC Certificate Of Recognition Program Review

Currently, the Pilot is working with the BC Municipality Safety Association to engage in the WorkSafeBC COR Auditor training to explore opportunities for the CSS Sector. This is based on WorkSafeBC examination which determined that Accreditation (Commission on Accreditation Rehabilitation Facilities, and Council On Accreditation) and the WorkSafeBC Certificate Of Recognition (COR) Program are not equivalent.

The Project Manager of the CSS WorkSafeBC Pilot will be undergoing the COR training in spring 2017, to serve as a resource and to provide support for the sector to explore improving access to the program.
